PHD PROGRAM IN ANTHROPOLOGY — FOR FALL 2017 ADMISSION

Penn State is currently the top-ranked anthropology program in the United States (NRC). Anthropology at Penn State brings a strongly empirical and integrative approach to the study of humans and non-human primates, including of our sociocultural complexity, behavior, population dynamics, ecology, and evolutionary and developmental biology. Incoming Ph.D. students use cutting-edge technologies for their research and participate in active field and laboratory projects that are externally funded (including by NSF and NIH). Students benefit from departmental strengths and expertise in archaeology, biological anthropology, and now human ecology, with numerous ongoing collaborations across these areas. Dual-title Ph.D. degree options are also available with Bioethics, Demography, and Human Dimensions of Natural Resources & the Environment. Admitted Ph.D. students are offered at least five years of funding support (four years if admitted with M.A./M.S.) with satisfactory progress.
